The City of Irvine offers a variety of transportation options for seniors and special needs populations. Irvine is served by the commuter iShuttle, OCTA buses, Metrolink, AMTRAK, and many state of the art roadways including I-405, I-5, SR 133, and SR-55. Public transportation and other mobility options are included in this Mobility Guide.



The iShuttle

Transportation for residents and employees through the Irvine Business Complex from the Tustin Metrolink Station and John Wayne Airport

Service

- The iShuttle is a fixed-route commuter shuttle system, which transports Irvine residents and employees to and from their home and/or workplace
- **Route A:** Connects Tustin Metrolink Station and John Wayne Airport along Von Karman Avenue
- **Route B:** Connects Tustin Metrolink Station and John Wayne Airport along Jamboree Road and Michelson Drive

Fare information

- Free with a valid Metrolink or OCTA pass
- \$1.00 boarding during peak hours
- \$0.50 boarding during off peak hours (9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.)
- Purchase a 10-ride card on-board for \$5.00

- Easy, convenient, efficient, and safe travel
- Operates Monday through Friday from 5:30 a.m. to 8:30a.m. and 2:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- Connects with Metrolink trains and OCTA buses
- Wheelchair accessible – accommodates two wheelchairs

Service

- Available to Irvine residents (18+) who are unable to drive due to permanent physical and/or cognitive disability. Pre-registration and eligibility determination required. (call 949-724-7433 for an application)

TRIPS offers

- Door-to-door service
- Lift equipped vehicles; wheelchair accessible
- Service area is limited to the City of Irvine and adjacent cities
- Shuttle service to Lakeview Senior Center
- Grocery shopping at various Irvine markets
- Rides are on a first-come-first-served basis and must be scheduled in advance
- Evening, weekend and holiday service contingent on demand

Fare information

- \$25 registration fee for initial enrolment
- \$20 annual renewal fee
- Ride tickets are purchased for \$30 and used for ride payment. Tickets must be purchased prior to making ride requests
- \$1.90 one way to any location in Irvine
- Transportation to other areas is limited and costs range from \$3.80 to \$7.60 depending on location and distance

Directions

- From I-5 Freeway: exit at Alton Parkway (Near Ada St.) Go East on Alton to Ada then North on Ada.
- From I-405 freeway: exit Irvine Center Drive. Go North on Irvine Center Drive to Alton, then East on Alton, and North on Barranca.

Parking

- Complimentary 1,500 parking spaces are available in the parking structure (72 hours overnight parking only)

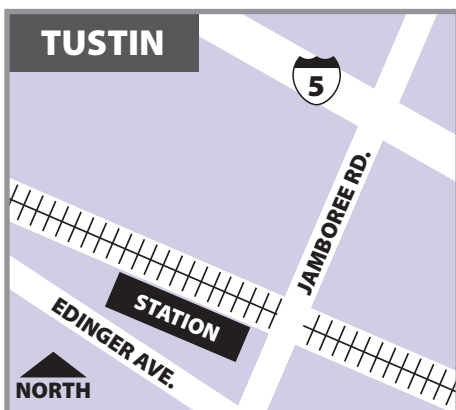

Amtrak is an intercity rail system throughout the nation with several stops throughout Orange County and Southern California

Service

- Amtrak provides daily trips to and from Los Angeles, San Diego, Santa Barbara, and San Diego with stops in the following Orange County cities: Irvine, Fullerton, Anaheim, Santa Ana, San Juan Capistrano, and San Clemente

Amtrak offers:

- Easy, convenient, reliable, and safe travel
- Most trains are wheelchair accessible and wheelchair assistance can be provided when trains do not have accessibility

Fare information

- Fares are calculated by distance
- Discounts for senior citizens, students, military (active duty and retired)
- Tickets may be purchased online, by phone, at a station ticket machine, or Amtrak counter (Irvine Station has an Amtrak counter)

- Regular fare: \$1.50
- Seniors (65+), person's with disabilities and Medicare holders: \$0.60
- Express Bus 758
 - Regular fare: \$3.00
 - Seniors (65+), person's with disabilities and Medicare holders: \$2.70

ACCESS (OCTA)

Transportation for residents with disabilities

Service:

- ACCESS is for people unable to use regular, fixed-route bus service due to functional, disability limitations
- Passengers meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) eligibility criteria and must be certified by ACCESS testing

Fare Information:

- Curb-to-curb is \$2.70 each way
- Door-to-curb, Curb-to-door is \$7.70 each way
- Door-to-door is \$12.70 each way

Age Well Senior Transportation Services

Non-Emergency medical transportation throughout South Orange County

Age Well Senior Transportation provides non-emergency medical transportation throughout Orange County. This program provides transportation to medical appointments including therapy, dentistry, hearing, dialysis, prescription pick-ups, testing and x-rays. Also, transportation to Kaiser Anaheim and Long Beach Veteran's Hospital.

General Information:

- Must be 60 years or older and ineligible for ACCESS
 - Must reside within Orange County's designated service area: Irvine, Aliso Viejo, Dana Point, Laguna Woods, Laguna Niguel, Laguna Hills, Laguna Beach, Lake Forest, Mission Viejo, Newport Beach, Rancho Santa Margarita, San Clemente, and San Juan Capistrano
 - Limited to 8 one-way trips per month with exceptions for on-going medical treatments (i.e. chemotherapy, dialysis, radiation treatments and physical therapy)
- Must be scheduled at least 24 hours in advance
 - Monday-Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
 - Transportation not available on major holidays

- \$2.00 per one-way trip--exact change
- (attendant rides free)

Volunteer Non-Emergency Medical Transportation Services

Irvine Senior Services Outreach Program

Irvine Senior Services Outreach program coordinates with volunteers to provide free transportation for seniors to medical appointments.

General Information:

- Transportation for residents 50+, unable to drive
- Volunteer drivers
- Cannot accommodate wheelchairs
- Operates Monday-Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

- Limited to two trips per month
- Appointments must be made 48 hours in advance
- Free (contributions to Friends of Outreach accepted)
