CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the Ad Hoc State Veterans Cemetery Committee was called to order on June 13, 2014, at 2:35 p.m. at Irvine Civic Center, 1 Civic Center Plaza, Conference and Training Center, Irvine, California by Committee Member Steven Choi.

ADDITIONS AND DELETIONS TO THE AGENDA

There were none.

WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

Committee Member Choi welcomed Committee Members, Ex-Officio Members and the public, including veterans present. Committee Member Choi provided a brief background on the Ad Hoc Committee and Resolution 14-27 adopted by the Irvine City Council. Self-introductions were made by the Committee Members, Ex-Officio Members and staff.

PRESENTATION

City Attorney Litfin provided a brief overview of the Ralph M. Brown Act and Conflict of Interest Code – Form 700 Filing provisions and responded to questions.

Discussion included: composition of a quorum, definition of and clarification that Ex-Officio members must comply with Brown Act laws, Ex-Officio member concerns that application of the Brown Act could interfere with their roles as State and County legislators and State Veterans Cemetery Committee discussions, alternatives to Ex-Officio membership, and that the City Council determined the Committee composition and may need to be revisited.

City Attorney Litfin was asked to prepare a written report regarding the issues raised.

COMMITTEE BUSINESS

1. Select Chairperson and Vice Chairperson

Committee Member Choi nominated Committee Member Lalloway to serve as Chairman. Committee Member Myers seconded the nomination.

ACTION: Moved by Committee Member Choi, seconded by Committee Member Myers and unanimously carried by the voting members present (Committee Member Jorgensen absent) to close the nomination period and select Committee Member Lalloway to serve as Chairman.

Chairman Lalloway nominated Committee Member Choi to serve as Vice Chairman. Committee Member Choi seconded the nomination.

Committee Member Krasney nominated Committee Member Cook to serve as Vice Chairman. Committee Member Cook seconded the nomination.

ACTION: By consensus, the nomination period was closed.

ACTION: Committee Member Choi was selected to serve as Vice Chairman by the following roll call vote of the voting members present (Committee Member Jorgensen absent):

2. Ad Hoc Committee Overview and Scope of Work

City Manager Joyce provided an overview of Resolution 14-27 adopted by the Irvine City Council and the Committee's scope of work as directed by the City Council.

Discussion included: the formality of the Committee meeting, consideration of different meeting formats, with Chairman Lalloway welcoming suggestions.

Zeke Hernandez spoke in support of a State Veterans Cemetery located at the Great Park.

ACTION: Moved by Chairman Lalloway, seconded by Committee Member Myers to receive and file.

3. Status of Assembly Bill 1453 Proposing a State Veterans Cemetery in Orange County

Ex-Officio Member Quirk-Silva provided an overview and status of Assembly Bill 1453 (AB1453) proposing a State Veterans Cemetery in Orange County. She also introduced John Spangler, Chief Consultant to the Assembly Committee on Veteran's Affairs; and Ex-Officio Member Wagner, a co-author of the proposed bill. Ex-Officio Member Quirk-Silva and Mr. Spangler responded to Committee Member questions.

Discussion included: outreach to the Governor's office, clarification of recent bill amendments, the need for a site analysis at possible locations, legislative deadlines, appropriation of funding and the need for an overview of the process to establish a State Veterans Cemetery.

No action was taken.

4. Presentation by Five Point Communities Management, Inc.

Committee Member Myers provided a presentation on behalf of Five Point Communities Management, Inc. about planning and legal opportunities and

constraints at Great Park sites and possible other sites in Orange County for a State Veterans Cemetery. Committee Member Myers responded to Committee Member questions.

Discussion included: Great Park land use/compatibility issues, other possible sites in Orange County that were presented, interest in the creation of a comparative matrix of the positives and negatives of noted sites, determining the evaluation scope and process in consideration of jurisdictional issues, and veterans' perspective on sites raised in the presentation.

Zeke Hernandez spoke in support of a Veterans Cemetery at the former El Toro site and encouraged the City of Irvine to take the lead.

A.D. Zelinko spoke in support of a Veterans Cemetery at the former El Toro site and suggested expediting site selection.

No action was taken.

5. Update on Proposition 41 – Veterans Housing and Homeless Prevention Bond Act of 2014

ACTION: By consensus of the voting members present (Committee Member Jorgensen absent); the item was tabled to a future meeting.

6. Ad Hoc Committee Calendar

City Manager Joyce indicated that staff would endeavor to complete a comparative matrix of sites identified at the meeting within 10-14 days for a June 27 meeting, but noted the likely need for additional time to complete the project.

Discussion included: next steps, future meeting format, moving the public comment period to the beginning of the agenda, minimum acreage, and a suggested alternative meeting date of July 11 in case the comparative matrix cannot be completed for the tentatively scheduled June 27 meeting.

STATUS OF ASSEMBLY BILL 1453 PROPOSING A STATE

VETERANS CEMETERY IN ORANGE COUNTY

RECOMMENDED ACTION

1. Receive and File.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Assembly Bill 1453 (AB 1453), if adopted, would direct the California Department of Veterans Affairs (CalVet), in voluntary cooperation with local government entities in Orange County, to design, develop, construct and equip a state-owned and operated Southern California Veterans Cemetery in Orange County. It would also direct CalVet to apply for federal Veterans Cemetery Grant Program funds for a State Veterans Cemetery in Orange County.

The following legislative actions occurred regarding AB 1453 since the Ad Hoc Committee's June 13 meeting:

- AB 1453 was amended by the author on June 19. One revision clarified that eligibility for interment at a State Veterans Cemetery in Orange County is "subject" to specified requirements described in federal law," consistent with its original intent. Another amendment provided for the consistent use of "moneys" in the plural (similar to our use of "funds"). The attached copy of AB 1453 shows the amendments in italics and strikeout format (Attachment 1).
- The Senate Committee on Veterans Affairs approved AB 1453 on June 24.
- The Senate Appropriations Committee will consider AB 1453 on Monday, August 4. (The State legislature is on recess July 4 – August 3).

If the State Legislature approves AB 1453 by the August 31 deadline, the Governor will have until September 30 to sign or veto the bill.

No. 1453

Introduced by Assembly Member Quirk-Silva (Coauthors: Assembly Members Daly, Mansoor, and Wagner)

(Coauthors: Senators Correa and Wyland)

January 9, 2014

An act to add Chapter 9.5 (commencing with Section 1410) to Division 6 of the Military and Veterans Code, relating to veterans, and making an appropriation therefor.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1453, as amended, Quirk-Silva. Southern California Veterans Cemetery.

The Department of Veterans Affairs (department) is created in state government and the Secretary of Veterans Affairs is the head of the department. Under existing law, the department, in voluntary cooperation with the Shasta County Board of Supervisors and the boards of supervisors of specified northern California counties, is required to design, develop, and construct a state-owned and state-operated Northern California Veterans Cemetery. Under existing law, the department, in voluntary cooperation with the Board of Supervisors of the County of Monterey, the City of Seaside, the Fort Ord Reuse Authority, and surrounding counties, cities, and local agencies, is required to design, develop, and construct the state-owned and state-operated veterans cemetery, which shall be located on the site of the former Fort Ord.

Existing federal law authorizes the Secretary of Veterans Affairs of the federal Department of Veterans Affairs to make a grant to any state for the purpose of establishing, expanding, or improving a veterans' cemetery owned by the state and operating and maintaining a veterans' cemetery.

This bill would require the department, in voluntary cooperation with local government entities in Orange County, to design, develop, construct, and equip a state-owned and state-operated Southern California Veterans Cemetery.—The Subject to specified requirements described in federal law, the bill would make all honorably discharged veterans and their spouses and children eligible for interment in the cemetery. The bill would require the department to establish a fee to be charged for interment of veteran spouses and eligible children.

The bill would create the Southern California Veterans Cemetery Master Development Fund, a continuously appropriated fund, and would require all moneys received for the design, development, construction, and equipment of the cemetery to be deposited in this fund. By creating a continuously appropriated fund, the bill would make an appropriation. The bill would also create the Southern California Veterans Cemetery Perpetual Maintenance Fund and would direct all moneys received for the maintenance of the cemetery, including those moneys received for the interment of a spouse or child, to be deposited in this fund.

The bill would make proposals for the construction, placement, or donation of monuments and memorials to the cemetery subject to review by a specified advisory committee and subject to final approval by the Secretary.

The bill would authorize the cemetery administrator to accept donations of personal property to be used for the maintenance, beautification, or repair of the cemetery. The bill would require cash donations to be deposited into the Southern California Veterans Cemetery Donations Fund, a continuously appropriated fund created by this bill, and would require the cash donations to be expended for the maintenance, beautification, and repair of the cemetery, as specified. By creating a continuously appropriated fund, the bill would make an appropriation.

The bill would require and authorize the department to adopt regulations, as specified.

The bill would declare the intent of the Legislature to appropriate funds in the annual Budget Act to support the department in carrying out the provisions of this bill. The bill would specify that if no -3- AB 1453

appropriation is made for these purposes, the department would not be required to comply with the provisions of this bill.

The bill would require the department to apply to the Veterans Cemetery Grants Program of the federal Department of Veterans Affairs for a grant of not more than an unspecified amount, which amount represents 100% of the estimated cost for designing, developing, constructing, and equipping the cemetery.

The bill would declare the intent of the Legislature to prohibit the expenditure of money moneys appropriated to the department until the department has received written approval of the grant request and a commitment from the federal Veterans Cemetery Grants Program that the funds appropriated under the grant are available for expenditure by the state, except as specified.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: yes. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 9.5 (commencing with Section 1410) is added to Division 6 of the Military and Veterans Code, to read:

Chapter 9.5. Southern California Veterans Cemetery

- 1410. (a) (1) The department, in voluntary cooperation with local government entities in Orange County pursuant to Section 1412, shall design, develop, construct, and equip a state-owned and state-operated Southern California Veterans Cemetery, which shall be located in Orange County, California.
- (2) The department shall oversee and coordinate the design, development, and construction of the cemetery.
- (3) For purposes of this chapter, "department" means the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- (b) (1) All-Subject to the eligibility requirements described in Section 2402 of Title 38 of the United States Code, as amended from time to time, all honorably discharged veterans and their spouses and children are eligible for interment in the cemetery. The department shall establish a fee to be charged for interment
- of veteran spouses and *eligible* children. The amount of the fee
- 21 shall not exceed the reasonable costs to the department for
- 22 interment in the cemetery.

- (2) Subject to Section 1418, for the purposes of this subdivision, the department shall adopt regulations to specify the eligibility requirements for interment in the cemetery.
- (3) All fees received pursuant to paragraph (1) shall be deposited the Southern California Veterans Cemetery Perpetual Maintenance Fund created pursuant to Section 1412.
- (a) For the purposes of Section 1410, all local government entities in Orange County may join together for the purpose of cooperating with the department in the design, development, construction, and equipment of the cemetery.
- (b) All moneys received for the design, development, construction, and equipment of the cemetery shall be deposited in the Southern California Veterans Cemetery Master Development Fund, which is hereby created in the State Treasury. Notwithstanding Section 13340 of the Government Code, money moneys in the fund—is are continuously appropriated to the department for the purpose of designing, developing, constructing, and equipping the cemetery. Moneys appropriated by the Legislature for these purposes shall also be deposited in the fund.
- (c) (1) Except as otherwise provided in Section 1416, all moneys received for the maintenance of the cemetery, including moneys received pursuant to subdivision (b) of Section 1410, shall be deposited in the Southern California Veterans Cemetery Perpetual Maintenance Fund, which is hereby created in the State Treasury. Any state funding for the annual maintenance of the cemetery shall be appropriated by the Legislature in the annual Budget Act.
- (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that, after the construction of the cemetery, an estimated dollars (\$ appropriated annually by the Legislature in the annual Budget Act or the participating southern California counties, or both, to the department for the operating costs of the cemetery.
- (3) It is the intent of the Legislature that total expenditures for operations and maintenance should not be more than) per fiscal year, as appropriated in the annual Budget Act.
- 1414. (a) Proposals for the construction, placement, or donation of monuments and memorials to the cemetery shall be subject to review by an advisory committee comprised of the cemetery administrator, representatives from local government entities within

Orange County, local veterans' service organizations, and others as approved by the secretary.

(b) All proposals for the construction, placement, or donation of monuments and memorials to the cemetery shall be subject to the final approval of the secretary.

- (c) Subject to Section 1418, the department shall adopt regulations for the policies and procedures to be followed with respect to the construction, placement, donation, and approval of monuments and memorials proposed to be placed on the cemetery grounds.
- 1416. (a) Notwithstanding Section 11005 of the Government Code, the cemetery administrator, subject to the approval of the secretary, may accept donations of personal property, including cash or other gifts, to be used for the maintenance, beautification, or repair of the cemetery.
- (b) Cash donations made pursuant to subdivision (a) shall be deposited into the Southern California Veterans Cemetery Donations Fund, which is hereby created. Notwithstanding Section 13340 of the Government Code, money moneys in the fund is are continuously appropriated to the department for the maintenance, beautification, and repair of the cemetery or, subject to the approval of the secretary, for a specified cemetery maintenance or beautification project designated by the donor.
- 1418. For purposes of carrying out the provisions of this chapter, the department may adopt regulations. All regulations adopted pursuant to this chapter shall be adopted pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act (Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code).
- SEC. 2. It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate funds in the annual Budget Act to support the Department of Veterans Affairs in carrying out the provisions of Chapter 9.5 (commencing with Section 1410) of Division 6 of the Military and Veterans Code. If no appropriation is made for these purposes, the Department of Veterans Affairs shall not be required to comply with the provisions of Chapter 9.5 (commencing with Section 1410) of Division 6 of the Military and Veterans Code.
- SEC. 3. (a) The Department of Veterans Affairs shall apply to the Veterans Cemetery Grants Program of the federal Department of Veterans Affairs for a grant of not more than 100

- 1 percent of the estimated cost for designing, developing, 2 constructing, and equipping the cemetery.
- (b) It is the intent of the Legislature that the money moneys to be appropriated in the annual Budget Act under Section 2 of this act-is are not expended until the Department of Veterans Affairs has received written approval of the grant requested under subdivision (a) and a commitment from the federal Veterans Cemetery Grants Program that the funds appropriated under the grant are available for expenditure by the state, except it is the intent of the Legislature that the department may expend an amount necessary for completion of the grant proposal from the funds intended by the Legislature to be appropriated under Section 2.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

On March 11, 2014, the Irvine City Council adopted Resolution No. 14-27 expressing interest in providing at least 100 acres of land at the Orange County Great Park for purposes of creating a Southern California Veterans Memorial and Cemetery (Attachment 1). The Ad Hoc Committee scope of work included sorting through the issues raised by Five Point Communities Management, Inc. on March 11, 2014 (Attachment 2) and developing a proposal to the Irvine City Council of possible cemetery sites after evaluating land use implications, constraints, legal provisions/restrictions, opportunity cost, compatibility, stakeholder input and other factors deemed relevant by the Ad Hoc Committee and City Attorney.

On June 13, 2014, former Ad Hoc Committee member Brian Myers provided a presentation to the Ad Hoc Committee of potential sites and issues of siting a veterans cemetery at the Orange County Great Park. His presentation also included four alternative sites located outside the City of Irvine that are beyond the intent and purview of the Ad Hoc Committee. However, as requested by the Ad Hoc Committee, for comparative purposes, staff was directed to prepare a Preliminary Site Suitability Matrix (Attachment 3) of the following sites discussed at the aforementioned Ad Hoc Committee meeting:

- Orange County Great Park
- County of Orange/Great Park (100 acres)
- Seal Beach Naval Weapons Station
- Los Alamitos Joint Forces Training Center
- Tustin Legacy
- Rancho Capistrano

WHEREAS, California is home to more veterans than any other state; and

WHEREAS, the majority of California's veterans live in Southern California; and

WHEREAS, the nearest currently open federal veterans cemetery to Orange County is the National Cemetery in Riverside, California; and,

WHEREAS, although the National Cemetery in Riverside is a beautiful resting place for veterans, due to various factors — distance from Orange County, regional geography, limited driving routes, and the population density of the region — the Orange County veterans, veterans from other Southern California coastal areas, and veterans families find access to available National Veterans Cemeteries challenging; and,

WHEREAS, the two State Veterans Cemeteries are also distant from Orange County — the Northern California State Veterans Cemetery is located near Redding in Igo, California, and the Central Coast State Veterans Cemetery will be located in Monterey; and,

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 1453 is pending in the California State Legislature, directing the California Department of Veterans Affairs to develop a master plan for a State-owned and operated Southern California Veterans Cemetery to be located in Orange County;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Irvine DOES HEREBY RESOLVE as follows:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That the City of Irvine supports the passage of Assembly Bill 1453 and the establishment of a Southern California Veterans Cemetery in Orange County.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. That the City of Irvine expresses its strong interest in providing at least 100 acres of land at the Orange County Great Park (formerly the Marine Corps Air Station at El Toro), for purposes of creating a Southern California Veterans Memorial and Cemetery.



Re: Agenda Item 4.3 - Resolution Supporting a Veteran's Cemetery in Orange County

Dear Mr. Mayor,

We have reviewed the memorandum and proposed resolution regarding the potential Veteran's Cemetery at the Orange County Great Park listed as Item 4.3 on the City Council Agenda Tuesday night. While we fully support the Orange County Veterans' effort to locate a California State Veterans Cemetery in Orange County, we urge you to more carefully consider City commitments to its location, specifically at the Orange County Great Park.

As a priority, we want to make certain that this proposal and any binding commitments to its location be filtered with consideration for land use compatibility, the size of the proposed project, impacts on infrastructure, traffic, consistency with surrounding neighborhood development, and a myriad of other issues. Irvine is renowned for its planning process and we encourage continuing its pattern of well studied and well thought out planning. There has been no study or joint planning effort on this concept and, frankly, we have not even been briefed on its intention since the item was just introduced this week. However, we are willing to engage in a study process with the City for potential sites in the City and the surrounding areas of the County.

As you are aware, one of the commitments of the December 2013 approvals was for Heritage Fields to undergo a \$2M planning effort and \$2M terraforming project for the Cultural Terrace and the 125-acre ARDA Transfer Site. This effort is just beginning and will be a perfect opportunity to discuss the need and potential issues of siting of a Veteran's Cemetery at the Great Park.

There are also a few issues related to our agreements with the City that are important to recognize as the City considers alternatives. The ARDA between the City and HFET has restrictions regarding the potential sale or lease of the City Property at the OCGP in the form of both land use and transactional constraints in Section 3.9. The ARDA, Section 3.9.2, has language that provides for land use restrictions on the 125-acre Transfer Site that were carefully considered by both parties. Further, there is language in Section 3.9.7 of the ARDA that establishes a process by which third party dispositions



of City Property at the OCGP can occur. The ARDA and other potential issues with agreements between HFET and the City need to be carefully considered prior the City making the commitments requested in Item 4.3 on tonight's agenda.

Again, while we fully support a resolution by the City of Irvine to support a proposed State Veterans Cemetery in Orange County, we respectfully encourage the City to consider a thoughtful planning process with us by forming a Committee with members of the City Council to discuss opportunities for this use at the Orange County Great Park and other alternative locations in Orange County.

Agreements and Zoning Issues Relating to Potential Cemetery Siting

I. INTRODUCTION

This memorandum summarizes the existing contractual restrictions on the siting of a cemetery at the Orange County Great Park and/or on the 125.5 Acre "ARDA Transfer Site." In summary: (1) cemetery uses are not permitted on the 125.5 acres "ARDA Transfer Site" until December 27, 2017; (2) the City cannot currently allow cemetery development on the 688 acre area of the Orange County Great Park that it has contracted, with Heritage Fields, to develop with sports park, bosque, golf, wildlife corridor, and other park-like uses, and (3) there are no current contractual restrictions on the City's ability to permit cemetery uses in the area designated "Cultural Terrace" on the Great Park Master Plan.

A more detailed discussion of these issues is provided in outline format below.

II. **DISCUSSION**

- 1. Amended and Restated Development Agreement ("ARDA") Land Use Restrictions: When the City entered into the ARDA on December 27, 2010, it bound itself to special land use restrictions that were applicable to (1) the then-existing Orange County Great Park Property, and (2) 130.5 acres of land (outside the Orange County Great Park boundaries) that were to be transferred to the City (the "ARDA Transfer Site"). The ARDA Transfer Site was later divided into a two parcels a five acre parcel at the corner of "LV" and "O" Street, and a 125.5 acre parcel bounded by "LQ" Street, "Z" Street, the Agua Chinon, and the Golf Course (a planned portion of the 688 acre area slated for development by Heritage Fields). For the remainder of this memorandum, the "ARDA Transfer Site" references pertain to the 125.5 acre parcel.
 - i. ARDA Transfer Site (130.5 Acres): From and after December 27, 2017, the City may develop cemetery, mortuary, and funeral home uses on the ARDA Transfer Site. (ARDA § 3.9.2.)

- ii. Orange County Great Park Property: The ARDA acknowledges the City's right to develop "Institutional Uses," which are defined at page 12 of the ARDA to include cemetery, and mortuary/funeral home uses, on the remaining Great Park Property. (ARDA § 3.9.3.)
- 2. Second Agreement with City of Irvine as Adjacent Landowner (ALA II): The City and Heritage Fields entered into the ALA II in November 2013. The ALA II gives Heritage Fields both the obligation and the right to develop 688 Acres with a variety of park-like uses including sports fields, a bosque, a golf course, a wildlife corridor, and additional park uses in the Upper Bee Canyon area. Development of this area is scheduled to take approximately five years. Therefore, no portion of the 688 acre area will be available for development for at least five years.

The remaining portion of the Orange County Great Park property is the area designed "Cultural Terrace" on the Great Park Master Plan. The ALA II requires that Heritage Fields provide \$2 million toward the funding of planning, feasibility, and related technical studies for the future development of that area. However, that funding obligation does not prohibit the City from independently pursuing cemetery, or other, development on all or some portion of the Cultural Terrace.

III. <u>CONCLUSION</u>

The Cultural Terrace is the only area of the Orange County Great Park that is, from a contractual standpoint, currently available for cemetery development. The ARDA Transfer Site will become contractually available on December 27, 2017. The remaining Great Park property will not be available for at least five years.
