Second Saturdays Restoration Gives Nature a Helping Hand By Amy Litton

Irvine has long supported the concept of "Open Space," but a newly developed program is allowing participants to work "hands on" in the field to help restore Irvine's

wilderness. Known as "Second Saturdays" because the program runs on the 2nd Saturday of each month, volunteers assist staff by working at the 5-acre Nature Center site and in 735-acre Bommer Canyon. Project assignments include trail maintenance, non-native plant removal, painting, and other assorted projects.

Already a phenomenal amount of work has occurred. The opportunity to work outdoors is attracting a growing cadre of volunteers. Often the accomplishments are subtle. In December, however, Trails4All and SHARE,

two groups supporting trail restoration. assisted students from Woodbridge High School in Irvine and Pacifica High School in Garden Grove in tackling Bommer Canyon's East Fork trail. Participants broke into groups to create channels that help direct water flow, create water bars, and fill in trail ruts formed by erosion. Their

efforts will improve trail safety and reduce future maintenance. Participants on the "Full Moon Hike," the "Mountain Bike Ride," and other programs will benefit from this project.

Removal of non-native or exotic species

is a priority within the Open Space Preserve, and volunteers to date have focused on efforts to eliminate castor bean in Bommer Canyon. The species is poisonous, and can

be used to create Ricin.
Hundreds of saplings have
been culled; dozens of young
and mature plants removed
manually. The removal of
exotics allows native plant
species to expand back into
their former range, and
potentially increases the
biological diversity of the area
by improving habitat for birds,
mammals, and other wildlife.

Whether the program attracts students needing community service hours, people who enjoy working outside, or those who enjoy working as a team toward a common goal, the program seems to be an unqualified success. The atmosphere is relaxed, the

volunteers friendly and dedicated. The volunteer force is directed by staff and experienced volunteers who oversee projects and ensure participant safety. If you've joined us already on a "Second Saturday" project – thank you! If not, simply stop by the Nature Center in the Turtle Rock Community Park on the 2nd Saturday of the
